# About the Club

The AOMCC was formed at a meeting called for 3pm on Saturday 24 November 1951, at the famous Ace Café on the North Circular Road in London, by a small group of enthusiasts from the London area. **Membership is open to all owners of, and enthusiasts for, Ariel motorcycles.**

In 1993 the club formed a limited company and "Ariel Motors Ltd" was reborn!

The club exists to provide opportunities for Ariel enthusiasts to meet and discuss motorcycling matters and to foster friendships between members, who are encouraged to form branches. There are branches throughout the UK, as well as 'social meets' and numerous overseas branches too. Being a branch member adds to the benefits of club membership but the unattached member is not forgotten. All full members receive the monthly magazine *Cheval de Fer*. This includes technical articles, members' news, branch reports letter and photographs. Members wishing to buy or sell spares may advertise free of charge and the magazine also carries trade advertisements relevant to Ariels. There's also an electronic main 'news group' to enable the 'technologically advanced' members to swap news and information.

The club also exists to advise members on matters concerning the running and maintenance of their machines, to encourage the production and availability of spares and generally to do its best to keep Ariels on the road. Spares organisers cater for the various models and technical queries can usually be answered by the club's archivist. The archives include some works drawings and indexed technical articles from over 40 years back numbers of *Cheval de Fer*.

The club encourages members to adopt the habit of quiet and courteous motorcycling and aims to establish and maintain good relations between motorcyclists and the general public. The AOMCC is affiliated to the British Motorcyclists' Federation and to the Federation of British Historic Vehicle Clubs. Through these it supports campaigns to protect the rights of motorcyclists against the ever increasing threats of restrictive legislation.

There are many events held each year and, although vastly increased in size since its formation, the AOMCC remains an informal and friendly club. Subscriptions are kept as low as possible and all club officers are unpaid volunteers.

Membership renewals are processed twice yearly – in March and September. Anyone joining from January to June will become a March renewal and July to December applications become September renewals. All members will receive a renewal form with the relevant (March or September) issue of *Cheval*.
